


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### 1. Action Taken Report on STUDENT Feedback: 2022-23

The Action Taken Report is based on the feedback received from students. Their suggestions and recommendations have been analysis and suggestions were placed in the IQAC meeting dated 31.07.2023, for appraisal and suggestions of members and for further action.

In the academic session, feedback was obtained through Google form. Total 475 feedback was received from the students. Based on the suggestions/recommendations from students, proactive measures on the following have been taken-up for improvements:

### Adequate availability of drinking water:

- Additional water filters have been installed in the campus to ensure easy access to clean and safe drinking water.
- Regular maintenance and monitoring have been implemented to ensure uninterrupted water supply.

### Timely cleaning of toilets and availability of sanitary facilities:

- A revised cleaning schedule has been implemented to ensure that toilets are cleaned more frequently throughout the day.
- Adequate sanitary facilities, including soap dispensers and sanitary napkin disposal units, have been provided.

### Improvement in canteen facility:

 Based on student feedback, the canteen menu has been updated to offer affordable food options.

### Improvement in Laboratory equipment:

• Regular monitoring are being done by the department to upkeep all laboratory equipment in optimal working condition.

### <u>Introduction of a basic computer course:</u>

• In response to students' demand, we have taken-up to conduct two days hands-on training course on ICT aims to equip students with basic skills that are increasingly relevant in today's world. 
### Enriching the college library with more books:


Expansion of Experiential Learning Opportunities and Application-Based Learning Outcomes: Acknowledging the importance of practical exposure and experiential learning,


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### 3. ACTION TAKEN REPORT ON FEEDBACK OF NON-TEACHING STAFF: 2022-23






### **Addressing Shortage of Faculty Members:**
